 - F. Stay tuned for and participate in the Capital Fund drive.
 - G. Pray for St. Paul and the people that work full time here and those who volunteer and serve on boards and committees and offices. They are all amazing servants.

From the Asset Management Board

We wanted to update the congregation on a few items as we head into the new fiscal year.

- We are coming up on one year since we changed out all of our lighting to LED throughout the building. We are happy to say that we have found a significant reduction in our electric usage because of the change. At this point we have saved approximately half the cost of the change out and should be seeing a return on our investment in another year. Many thanks to Bill Loats, Michael Puls, and June Harris for all their work on that project.
- 2. In addition, we have been receiving credits on our electric bills from Neighborhood Solar, our electric supplier, totaling \$546.44 in savings so far this year.
- 3. We have begun work with an engineer to redesign the boiler and pumps for our heating system to come up with a more efficient and redundant system.
- 4. We welcome new members Andrea Wellington and Karen Eichelman to the Cemetery Committee. Thank you for your willingness to serve.
- 5. We want to thank Dave Carnes for being a regular and faithful volunteer on our work days on the third Saturday of the month. We encourage anyone who is willing to help to come out on a work day. You can come for the entire time from 9am to 12pm, or for just an hour if that is all the time you have. We have jobs for all skill levels and abilities.
