News From the Elders

- In response to the Council's strategic planning initiative, Pastor and the elders have begun discussing how St. Paul might work with other LCMS congregations in the Baltimore community so that, for example, we might be able to share the cost of having a vicar (someone training to be a Pastor) from one of the seminaries or a Director of Christian Education (DCE) intern in Baltimore. Having a vicar, for example, would cost \$2,000/month in salary as well as the cost of lodging and health insurance for a year.
- The pandemic caused St. Paul to lose track of congregation members. The elders have been writing letters encouraging absent members to return to worship and have in some cases asked the congregation to remove those who have not been in church in more than 5 years. We now ask each of you to reach out to any absent members you may know to see how they are and to encourage them to return to worship at St. Paul.

St. Paul Men's Group

After a fairly long interruption caused by the pandemic, the St. Paul Men's Group had its first meeting convened by Jim Baeder on Saturday, September 16, with breakfast, prayers, and a devotion. Fourteen men attended the meeting in the Fellowship Hall. From the Mission Board

Kingdom Growth Ministry

In our budget, under Mission Board, are listed several ministries under the heading Kingdom Growth. The donations for these ministries are our St. Paul tithe. Eleven percent (11%) of our offerings from white envelopes, loose plate and holiday collections (all of these are general fund) are used for our kingdom growth donations. These offerings are given to missions outside of our congregation. In February, Pastor Harmon, our Southeastern District President, visited and gave us a wonderful overview of how our funds help at the district level. Over the next church year, we will be highlighting the other missions and we will provide some "hands-on" opportunities.

Concordia Prep School

Concordia Prep (CP) is a co-educational Lutheran Middle and High school located in Towson. It has a strong, rigorous academic program, and is "... a compassionate, Christcentered community of servant leaders" (from website Welcome). It offers a faith-based education, with opportunities for fine and performing arts, available college and AP courses, a varied sports program (including 5



championships in the past 5 years!) and is home to a campus church. This year the school has over 420 students. St. Paul has long been a financial supporter of CP. We are members of the Baltimore Lutheran High School Association and pledge support annually. Students from our church and school receive a tuition credit because of our connection. Over the years, many grade school graduates and church members have gone to the school, even with the distance. This past year, three of our 5th graders were accepted (and Ogtay Orujov - Scholar Athlete, Principal's Award -- was a 2023 graduate!)

Concordia Prep was opened in 1965. It was then named Baltimore Lutheran High, with name change coming in 2014. St. Paul was not one of the first Association churches, but over the years we have been part of the history:

- Dottie Frech's father (Debbie and Denise's grandfather), William Rach, was instrumental in starting Baltimore Lutheran (William Rach Lutheran Activity Center-LAC- named for him)
- Allan Schmidt, St. Paul's 1st principal, later became teacher, principal and Executive Director
- Present congregation members have taught there: Dottie Frech, Steve Haar, Roy Krakat, Irene Giguere, Norm Giguere
- STAR Program (now Giguere) for students with learning disabilities founded by Irene in 1981
- Board of Directors: John Borth (now president), Kevin Dungey (past president), Debbie Frech,
 Dottie Frech
- Distinguished Alum recognition: John Borth, Debbie Frech, Suzanne Giguere

A church-plant, a partnership of CP and First Lutheran, Towson, was started in 2020. The name New Thing, based on Isaiah 43:18 – 19, meets for worship on Sundays at 10 a.m. on campus. Pastor Couser serves both the church and Concordia Prep.



On **October 15**, a representative will be at St. Paul to share the ministry of the school. They will speak during our service time and be available after, during our Fellowship Hour downstairs.

To focus on this Kingdom Growth mission, we have an October Concordia Prep prayer calendar. It will be available on the narthex credenza. Please take one and lift up their faculty, staff and needs to the Lord. If you Google "Concordia Prep", their website has pictures of the staff (to help focus your prayer). Their ministry is part of OUR mission- so prayer, support of fundraisers, and attending campus events are ways we can reach out to strengthen their witness and purpose.
