For Those Who Desire to Receive the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at St. Paul in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor or an elder. (Non-alcoholic wine is available in the center of the communion trays.)







Daily Lectionary Readings

Following historic practice, this lectionary presents a continuous reading through the books of the Bible, often associating certain books with particular seasons of the Church Year. These readings are in the bulletin each week. Two readings of 15-25 verses each are provided for each day – one from each the Old and New Testaments. Under this plan, nearly all of the New Testament and approximately one-third of the Old Testament are read each year.

Daily Readings: *Jan 7:* Ezek 1:1–14, 22–28, Rom 1:1–17; *Jan 8:* Ezek 2:1—3:11, Rom 1:18–32; *Jan 9:* Ezek 3:12–28, Rom 2:1–16; *Jan 10:* Ezek 18:1–4, 19–32, Rom 2:17–29; *Jan 11:* Ezek 33:1–20, Rom 3:1–18; *Jan 12:* Ezek 34:1–24, Rom 3:19–31; *Jan 13:* Ezek 36:13–28, Rom 4:1–25.
